CPW FINALIZES NEW FIVE YEAR BIG GAME SEASON STRUCTURE

2020 will bring about some changes to our mountain operations. These changes will allow for a longer break in between each rifle season, and therefore, provide less hunting pressure on our wildlife. Below is a list of 2020 season dates for our mountain operations west of I-25.

Archery Elk: Sept 2 - 30 1st Rifle Elk Only: Oct 10 - 14 2nd Rifle Elk/Deer: Oct 24 - Nov 1 3rd Rifle Elk/Deer: Nov 7 - 13 4th Rifle Elk/Deer: Nov 18 - 22

Our Eastern Plains operation dates will remain pretty much the same for the next five years for all of our plains elk, muzzleloader deer, rifle deer, and pronghorn hunts.

FEATURED RECIPE Johnny's Elk & Chorizo Meatloaf

Ingredients:

- 2 lbs Ground Elk
- 1 lb Chorizo
- 1 cup Diced Bell Pepper
- 1 cup Diced Onion
- 1 cup Bread Crumbs
- 2 tbsp Black Pepper 1 tbsp Salt 1 tbsp Garlic Salt 2 Eggs
- 2 15 oz cans Tomato Sauce

Preparation: Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

1. Lightly coat the bottom of a 9 X 13 in dish with tomato sauce. 2. In a large bowl blend together the ground elk, chorizo, bell peppers, onion, bread crumbs, salt, pepper, garlic salt, eggs and 7.5 oz of tomato sauce. Form ingredients into a large loaf.

3. Put remaining tomato sauce over meatloaf. Cover meatloaf with tin foil and start baking process.

4. Cook for 1 hr 30 mins. After 1 hr, check internal temp of meat loaf with thermometer. When temp reaches 150 to 160 degrees, meatloaf should be done. Cook for additional 30 mins, if needed.



COLORADO DRAW APPLICATIONS

- Limited license big game applications for 2020 will **OPEN** the first week of March. We will get packets out to those of you who already have 2020 hunts on the books.
- The Limited license big game application **DEADLINE** is the first week of April. As long as we have all of your information, we will ensure your application is submitted on time.
- All resident and nonresident applications for all big game will only be accepted online; therefore, we will require a credit card authorization for each of you applying.
- Due to the transition to the new integrated Colorado Parks and Wildlife purchasing system, you are required to provide us with an accurate email address.





In April of 2018, Jacob "JD" Dentinger was diagnosed with an inoperable form of glioblastoma, a rare but aggressive form of brain cancer. JD's tumor is in the center of his brain where the thalamus gland is located. JD has conquered 3 brain surgeries, 40 radiation treatments, 92 doses of chemotheraphy, and countless doctors visits. His love for the outdoors runs deep as he began hunting whitetail, grouse, and bear at the age of 12. In September 2019, JD was awarded a guided elk hunt by the Minnesota Outdoor Adventure Foundation. It has been 21 months since JD was first diagnosed, and he continues to conquer cancer.
